


Diagram 1: Google Ngrams results for "preface"




Figure 1: Number of Professional Plays Published Each Year, 1576–1660




Diagram 1 The proliferation of print in the late eighteenth century




Diagram 4: Pie chart of generic terms frequently used in 36 prefaces from 1650-1750 generated in WordStat




Diagram 5: Bar graph of generic terms frequently used in 36 prefaces from 1650-1750 generated in WordStat




Diagram 6: "Probability Pie" frequently used terms used in 36 prefaces from 1650-1750 generated in WordStat
